Overview

This novel focuses on the illness anorexia. Unlike many other books on this subject, the author does not let the sufferer herself speak; it is her younger sister who talks to us. In condensed monologues - written in free verse - addressed to the older sister who remains speechless behind the closed door of her room throughout, the protagonist tries to bridge the abyss of the illness and win back her admired big sister for herself, the family, and life. This is an important text about the far-reaching effects of a serious illness.

Tyrolia Verlag have become known for publishing "unconventional and experimental children's and youth literature, literature beyond the mainstream" (White Ravens editorial team, 2022) and this novel is no exception. Presented on the page as short vignettes comprising single line sentences, almost like a series of lists, this short but impactful novel shares the pain and heartbreak of witnessing a family member struggle.


In this unusual, poetic second-person monologue, a young girl struggles with her relationship with her older sister. Free verse written in precise and moving language gives voice to her memories of better times and her worries for the future. Her concern for her older sister and her mental illness together with the suffering of the whole family can be felt through the girl's words without ever explicitly naming the condition anorexia. The family's isolation is made visible through the image of the closed door behind which one sister conceals herself and before which the other family members remain standing. We witness the internal perspective of a distressed family, full of pain and open-ended questions. At the same time, the external view of the sister unfolds, the ways in which she is changing, her not-just-physical disappearance.
